

ECUADOR'S PRESIDENT ATTACKED.

GUAYAQUIL, Feb. 8, via Galveston.—Señor Don J. M. P. Caamano, President of Ecuador, was attacked on Saturday night at Yaguachi, and one of his aides was killed. Señor Caamano made his escape to Guayaquil, where he is closely guarded by his adherents. On his arrival in this city a disturbance occurred with some of his political opponents, and cries of "Vive Alfaro!" were freely uttered. During the mêlée the Chief of Police and three others were killed and several persons were wounded.
